Format:

- APA or MLA for in-text citations and bibliography (“References” or “Works Cited”)
- Times New Roman, 12 pt. Font.
- Double-spaced.
- 1” Margins (should be the default setting).

Length: Each source should have about 150 words of annotation. The minimum word count for your annotated bibliography is 1,000 words. You can add more sources and write fewer words for each one, or pick fewer sources and write more annotations. The minimum number of sources is six.

Summary: In the past few weeks, you learned about crafting a research proposal, finding sources, and determining the rhetorical situation of a research project. Specifically, you were taught that planning is crucial for the design of the research, that selecting credible sources will elevate your research, and that there is a rhetorical element to all aspects of research and science. You were reminded that scientific knowledge is the product of rhetorical persuasion. Therefore, you are prepared to compose an annotated bibliography that outlines the existing literature on your topic. Remember that you do not have to use all of the sources that you include in your annotated bibliography in your final research paper. The purpose of the annotated bibliography is to collect resources that you can analyze and deem worthy enough for your own research. You should ask yourself the following questions when analyzing potential sources:

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- Is the research credible?
- How are you going to apply the research to your research project?

Required Content:

- You have a minimum of six sources.
- You have a minimum of 1,000 words.
- You discussed the purpose of each source.
- You identified the intended audience of each source.
- You discussed the authors' credentials of each source.
- You provided a summary of each source.
- You deemed the research either credible or not credible.
- You considered the implications of each source.
- You outlined how you will or will not use each source for your research project.
